And if they don't grow, it is as Paul said to the Philippians, "Christ in me is to live, to die is to

When I read of the terrible tragedies like terrorism in Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, I want to get out there and change the world. But it is better if we remember

that we called to **be the part of the world God is changing,** instead of going out to try to change the world. "Let there be peace on earth, and let it begin with ME." It is so, so much easier to point a finger at all the evil in the world than it is to see the sin in my own life, to see how much more I need to embrace Christ's peace for myself and those around me. Yes, we want to make a difference, and let's do by joining the Spirit in making changes in us and around us right here and right now.

When I hear that young adults these days are rejecting the church as judgmental, out of touch, or unnecessary, I want to make a convincing argument

to the contrary. But what we really need to focus on this: being devoted to "faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is love."

"They will know we are Christians by our love." Our vision is to be an intergenerational, diverse community



of fully-devoted followers of Jesus Christ (JC) who reach out with the good news of Christ's love, who grow strong in the service of God and neighbor, who send one another out with the joy of the Holy Spirit. This vision of Peace calls us to reach, grow strong, and send. All of these actions are other-oriented, for that is what Christ was. He came to preach good news to the poor and release to the captives. He came to heal the sick and eat with outcasts. He came to care for children and to give his life for all of us.

Live like Christ and leave the outcome to the sovereign will of God. Be faithful. Be generous. Be kind. Be the church of Jesus Christ—embody Christ in his perfect humanity.


Fundraising Goal is Met for Construction of Sanctuary

Building Fund 2 for the sanctuary has just reached the **\$1,021,450** mark. Hallelujah!

Our target was to raise \$1million dollars in a three year campaign as a precursor for going for another approximately \$1 million loan from a lending institution. Since we have achieved that target through the wonderful generosity of our congregation in just a couple of months, we have initiated conversations with the lending institutions to develop terms. Our first meeting is with the Presbytery Investment & Loan Program (PILP), who has already indicated their willingness to meet our funding requirements. Once funding terms have been developed, we will start detailed architectural and engineering design of the sanctuary. The whole design & construction cycle is estimated to be in the 14- to 18-month time frame.

Completion of the new water and sewer lines is finally in sight. After better than a year's time to secure the necessary county & fire marshal approvals, we are within another 2-3 weeks of getting directly connected to the county systems. This will provide our site with our own access to the county systems & allow us to separate ourselves from the previous site owner, Aurora, with improved services. The new systems have been designed to encompass the addition of the new 390-seat sanctuary.

Diaper Drive

SOLVE, a maternity home for unwed young mothers, was the recipient of our Mother's Day diaper and wipe drive. 4,599 diapers and 1,748 wipes were delivered to SOLVE on May 21st. Members of the Mission Team and others were met by members of the executive team of SOLVE to accept the donations and give a tour of both of the SOLVE homes in Bradenton. The Executive Director was very thankful in receiving our gift. Peace was also able to get publicity as a photographer from the Herald Tribune wrote an article that appeared in a number of papers and on-line.
